In radiology circle, the frequent discussions nowadays are about the migration of radiologists from the public sector to the private sector and the setting up of new radiological imaging centers. About 2 years ago, we saw that most radiologists that resigned from Hospital Authority joined the private hospitals which have been expanding their imaging services. However, it is a recent phenomenon that there are more and more radiologists grouping together and setting up sizable imaging centers which, apart from the conventional facilities, may also provide CT, MR and PET imagings. But not only the radiologists do that, other clinicians are forming groups to set up imaging centers too. We are told that a few such centers may not have regular in-house radiologists to report the examinations, the images from the examinations would be sent to radiologists for reporting on a case-to-case basis. In Hong Kong, any registered doctor can be the license owner of radiological equipment. There is currently or regrettably no regulations on the possession of non-irradiating imaging equipments like ultrasound machines, MRI and PET scanners. With the spiraling demands on radiological examinations for diagnostic and therapeutic purposes, it is easy to understand why there is an increase in size and numbers of imaging centers all over Hong Kong and why our colleagues join to set up imaging centers which can provide the needed service and may yield good financial return. Along this trend, even solo practitioners are now setting up their own imaging facilities. Though there is always "turf battle" for many years on who should be doing the examinations or owning the equipments, we see the present scenario as a big new wave and is different from the "turf" battle in the past.

Are we anticipating more and more of these imaging centers being set up by our clinical colleagues of other specialties and are we seeing the beginning of losing the referrals from them and is this trend the best for our patients?

Radiologists are trained, as defined by our curriculum, on the principles and techniques of imaging. Using this acquired training we play an important role in steering the direction of radiological and interventional management of the patients. We provide expert and certified reports on the findings and often suggest opinions from our diagnosis. After all, imaging examination is part of a consultation and we as radiologists share the clinical responsibilities with other team members, namely, clinicians and paraclinical colleagues, in the management of patients. As such, imaging examinations should only be done under good indications and appropriate protocols. In this electronic era when the equipment can perform under preset parameters, can have automatic voxel reformation and computer-aided diagnosis, the radiologist working in his cockpit during the course of imaging, is the one to design the imaging protocols and gives the added value of expertise to the patient management throughout the management course. With the above belief, the College should take issues for personal not trained in the relevant field to perform imaging examinations and reporting the findings. The examination should be properly reported and the public should not accept no proper reports after undergoing diagnostic investigations. Though time will tell, I believe that we radiologists can remain as staunch partner with our colleagues when we insist on delivery of quality radiology services.

#### "Macro view"

During a review on Qualifying Assessment, the Council was informed that although the Assessors were satisfied with the academic performance, the Assessors felt that there was a general lack of "macro vision" and in-depth understanding of important health care issues relating to development and delivery of radiology service of the candidates in recent years. The Council thought these issues were important especially as we are seeing the ever important role we are playing in the multidisciplinary approach in-patient care. We discussed about how to bring "macro issues" like healthcare management, healthcare financing, and role of radiologists etc. into the attention of our trainee radiologists and to stress to the trainers to incorporate these into their training scope. It is certainly not an easy area to tackle but we certainly welcome suggestions on these and hope to open up forums for discussion from all members.

#### CME/CPD

There has always been a constant ongoing discussion and proposal of changes on the requirements on CME/CPD in the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. The Academy Colleges are involved in the discussion at 2 levels, namely, from our College, our Warden is a member in the HKAM Education Committee and I sit in the HKAM Council Meeting. Those who are HKAM Fellows will also be informed of the eventual changes and the details from the HKAM newsletter and website. However, I wish to take the opportunity to update you on the issues discussed and the changes that will take place.

- The changing scope of the continuous education requirement: Our present scope of Continuous Medical Education (CME) will be expanded to become Continuous Professional Development (CPD). The Academy Colleges are encouraged to develop CPD by various means e.g. awarding more points for CPD activities and educating Fellow how to achieve CPD. It has been decided the starting from 1 January 2011, mandatory CPD would take place.
- Starting from 1 January 2008, all Colleges would set a capping for passive CME, so that Fellow would have to do other activities which may include CPD. The capping should be at 75 points or below.
- The number of CME/CPD points required for Fellow of different specialties and subspecialties should be the same, and Fellow accredited for more than one specialty/subspecialty within the same College should not be required to obtain more than 90 points.
- Some specialty or subspecialty-specific CME/CPD activities should be allowed to suit the need of different Colleges.
- Flexibilities would be allowed for individual Colleges should they want to have faster pace to implement mandatory CPD.

We understand that it is a global trend to implement CPD requirement for the medical profession but individual specialty may encounter her own difficulties in mapping out the relevant CPD activities and implementing them. To develop CPD in our College is even more complicated, being made up of 3 specialties and multiple subspecialties. As these requirements will in due course become mandatory requirement, we hope to have comments and proposals at this stage of development so to ensure the implementation will be smooth and satisfactory to all. Do send your inputs to the College representatives or to Dr. Peter Choi and Dr. Susan Chan. And do take note of the development from the HKAM communications.

## Joint Scientific Meeting of RCR & HKCR and 13th ASM of HKCR

Joint Scientific Meeting of the Royal College of Radiologists and Hong Kong College of Radiologists, and the 13<sup>th</sup> Annual Scientific Meeting of the Hong Kong College of Radiologists

#### 21st - 23rd October 2005

This is the first time that the two Colleges have made history and joined hands to organize a scientific conference in Hong Kong, with a faculty formed by distinguished and renowned speakers from both Colleges. The idea of a joint scientific meeting was initiated by our Presidents, Professor Janet Husband and Dr. Lilian Leong. The programme co-ordinators were Drs. Richard Nakielny and Jennifer Khoo. An exciting and stimulating programme was drawn up within a few weeks, thanks to the extraordinary support and cooperation from our speakers and secretariats. From the Royal College of Radiologists, we have Professor Janet Husband, Dr. Jane Barrett, Dr. Frances Calman, Dr. Jeremy Jenkins, Dr. David Lindsell, Professor Derrick Martin, Dr. Richard Nakielny, Dr. David Spooner and Dr. Irving Wells. Representing Hong Kong College of Radiologists are Dr. Greg Antonio, Dr. KW Chiu, Dr. SM Chow, Dr. YT Fu, Dr. Simon Ho, Dr. PL Khong, Dr. Philip Kwok, Dr. KH Wong, Dr. Lisa Wong and Dr. YY Yau.

We also have other overseas speakers joining the faculty, including Professor Byung Ihn Choi from Korea, Professor Osamu Matsui from Japan, and Professor Carmelo Pozzo from Italy.

We are highly honoured that Professor Janet Husband, President of the Royal College of Radiologist, had accepted our invitation to deliver a lecture entitled: "Imaging of abdominal and pelvic lymph nodes".

This year, the subspecialty focus sessions were on Interventional Radiology and Musculoskeletal Radiology for Clinical Radiology, and Neuro-oncology for Clinical Oncology.

As in last year, a Radiographers' Session had been organized in collaboration with the Hong Kong Radiographers' Association to promote the exchange of valuable experience with our radiographer colleagues.

The meeting was attended by over 450 participants. 79 proffered papers were accepted, 38 for oral presentation and 41 as posters.

Using the Education Fund generated from the Radiology 2000 Congress, sponsorship was offered to 3 overseas delegates who have been nominated by their local Radiology professional bodies.

RSNA 2005 Dr Ting Ho

The Scientific Assembly & Annual Meeting of the Radiological Society of North America (RSNA) - the largest medical meeting in the world, is held annually since the RNSA foundation in 1915. The 91<sup>st</sup> meeting was held as usual in Chicago, at the McCormick Place, from November 27 to December 2, 2005. More than 61,000 people attended RSNA 2005, which was the second-highest attendance ever for the RSNA annual meeting. I was very fortunate to be there this year and had enjoyed a wonderful and memorable week in Chicago. I would like to use this opportunity to share with all of you this valuable experience.

Each year, radiologists and representatives from many specialties and disciplines within radiology and the entire healthcare arena meet at the RSNA annual meeting to exchange information, share educational experiences and introduce new technology in order to cultivate innovative solutions for today's healthcare challenges. This year's theme was "Connecting for lifelong learning", which exactly embodied this vision.

No one would be bored at the meeting as there was a board spectrum of educational and professional activities, including more than 300 scientific sessions and 2000 oral and poster presentations. I had presented a scientific paper during the meeting and had attended many different courses and workshops. I particularly enjoyed the case-based review courses and the digital mammography self assessment workshop, which provided practical and interactive training sessions for participants to test their skills and improve their performance in mammography screening.

This year's technical exhibition at the RSNA annual meeting was also the largest ever in terms of square footage and number of exhibitors.
